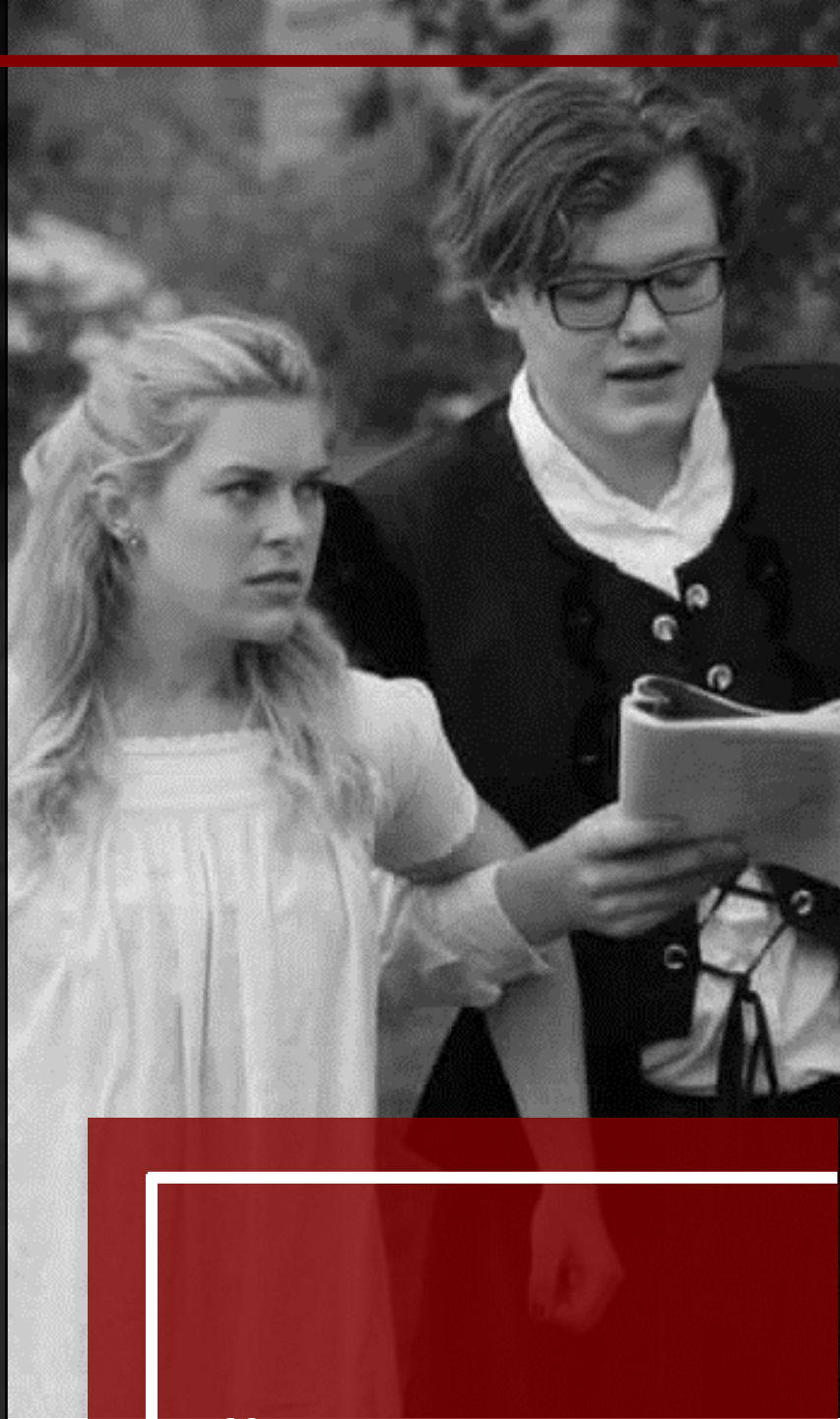

Elora Community Theatre (ECT) is seeking a new storage and rehearsal space after what we can only describe as a tough year.

In the summer of 2020, something you may have heard called COVID, shut us down. As ECT depends on performance sales to assist with rent, we unfortunately could no longer afford our rehearsal space in West Montrose and made the ultimate decision to pack our bags. At that time, we were incredibly lucky to be offered some free storage space from Skyline at the plaza on Tower Street in Fergus. We would like to extend a huge thank-you yet again for the wonderful storage space we have been utilizing over the past year.

We are happy to say that revenue is finally coming back in again due to outdoor performances and a planned indoor show at the end of the year, "COVID gods willing". As such, we are now looking for a more permanent home for rehearsals, storage, and to build sets when needed. Elora Community Theatre will need about 3,000 sq. ft. of heated space, with plumbing to suit our groups needs, but most importantly rent needs to be reasonable.
